

REPs Ireland FAQs:

1. What does REPs Ireland stand for?

REPs Ireland stands for: Register of Exercise Professionals

2. What is REPs Ireland?

REPs Ireland is an independent register for exercise professionals in Ireland

3. What is a REPs Ireland qualification?

This is an independently verified and quality assured qualification that maps to the standards and criteria set out by REPs Ireland

4. What is REPs Ireland registration?

REPs Ireland is an independent not for profit organisation that operates a public register of exercise professionals. If eligible to join members can be searched on the website directory

5. Am I eligible to join REPs Ireland?

Applicants who have completed a REPs Ireland accredited course with a REPs Ireland Approved Education Provider are eligible to join. You can find a list of Approved Education Providers [here](#). If you qualified with over 2 years ago you will be required to submit evidence of continued professional development (CPD)

6. Can I still join REPs Ireland if I didn't qualify with an Approved Education Provider?

It is still possible to join REPs Ireland if you have not qualified with an approved provider. Such applications are known as non-standard applications and are subject to extra fees (€50 processing + €65 membership and €100 exam). This can be a very lengthy process (see next Question) and is subject to independent assessment from one of our approved instructors. There is no guarantee of successful admission

7. How long does a non-standard application take?

Non-standard applications can take up to 6 weeks to process from time of submission.

8. Does REPs Ireland provide insurance cover?

No REPs Ireland does not provide insurance cover, we do however have a partnership with an insurance provider who offers a discounted rate to REPs Ireland members. Details of this are issued in member welcome email. More info is available [on our website](#)

9. What is CPD?

CPD is continuous professional development or otherwise put, industry related ongoing learning. This could be courses/workshops/webinars/events or even in house training. REPs Ireland requires registered members to obtain ongoing CPD to maintain membership

10. How much is membership

Membership fee is €65 per year. Membership is free to applicants in their first year of qualifying. Renewal fee is €65 [link here](#)

11. What are the membership benefits?

There are a number of membership benefits available which include reduced rate insurance through our partner insurance provider and discounted ongoing training with our partners in the Leisure, Health and Fitness Skillnet. A full list of benefits is [available here](#)

13. Where do I add additional qualifications or CPD?

15. I have registered but still have not received anything yet?

Every REPs Ireland application is subject to independent assessment and can take up to 3 working days to process. If there is a problem with your application, we will let you know as soon as possible.

16. I have joined REPs Ireland but cannot login to my profile.

17. Can I transfer my REPs Ireland Qualification to another country's REPs Register?

As a member of ICREPs, REPs Ireland Members can transfer their qualifications to other ICREPs member registers. [You can find a list here](#)

18. How do I transfer my qualifications to another register?

If you wish to transfer your qualifications, you will require a Letter of Portability from REPs Ireland. This will cost €20 and can be requested by emailing info@repsireland.ie. *Must be a REPs Ireland member or eligible to be

19. I have registered with a REPs register in another country; can I join REPs Ireland?

If your REPs register has a portability agreement with REPs Ireland, you can join REPs Ireland by sending us a Letter of Portability from your register and then paying the €65 membership fee
